

SB 823 Data Collection Summary 2021-22 Data Set

The Chief Probation Officers of California have developed an “SB 823 Data Collection” survey to collect data from county probation departments regarding the implementation of SB 823/92 (DJJ Realignment). This document summarizes information from two collection periods: 1. July 2021 – December 2021, and 2. January 2022 – June 2022. This self-reported data represents responses from all 58 county probation departments and CPOC continues to work with counties to improve data collection and consistency.

Secure Youth Treatment Facility Orders

- There were 229 youth ordered to an SYTF in 2021-22.
 - There were 224 youth ordered to an SYTF within the county of adjudication in 2021-22.
 - There were 5 youth ordered to an SYTF outside the county of adjudication in 2021-22.
 - There were 10 youth requiring sexual behavioral treatment ordered to an SYTF in 2021-22.
 - There were 18 youth requiring specialized mental health treatment ordered to an SYTF in 2021-22.

Division of Juvenile Justice Commitments

- There were 41 youth committed to DJJ in 2021-22.

Historical DJJ Commitments

- Prior to the enactment of SB 823, according to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, there were 334 youth committed to DJJ in calendar year 2019.

Baseline Term Modifications

- There were 11 youth with a baseline term decrease pursuant to WIC 875(e)(1) in 2021-22.
- There were 3 youth with a baseline term increase pursuant to WIC 875(b) in 2021-22.

Adult Court Transfers

- There were 366 youth subject to a motion to transfer from juvenile court to a court of criminal jurisdiction in 2021-22.
- There were 42 youth transferred from juvenile court to a court of criminal jurisdiction in 2021-22.
