- Provides services in rural areas of the Imperial County:
  - i. Westmorland, CA
  - ii. Heber, CA
  - iii. Niland, CA
- Program is conducted 3 times a week at each site, from 3:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
- Youth are between ages of 9-13
- Average of 10 youth per site
- The youth are introduced to prosocial behaviors to reduce the risk of juvenile delinquency.

In addition to Youth Service Specialists (YSS) providing programming at their respective sites, they also spend a portion of their time working with youth housed at Imperial County Juvenile Hall and the Imperial County's local Shelter Home.

Project ASPIRE YSS work with youth at the aforementioned locations five days per week for approximately three hours per day. The staff provide services similar to those offered at their afterschool sites. Project ASPIRE's YSS strive to serve these youth in a supportive role while providing educational and recreational activities, arts and crafts, and cultural enrichment activities.
